The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders of the Company with requisite information with respect to the resolutions to be proposed at the forthcoming annual general meeting of the Company to be held on 12th June, 2007 (the “2007 Annual General Meeting”) relating to (1) the re-election of the Directors of the Company who will retire and, being eligible, have offered themselves for re-election at the 2007 Annual General Meeting, and (2) the grant of a general mandate (the “Repurchase Mandate”) to the Directors of the Company for the repurchase of its ordinary shares of HK\$0.01 each (“Ordinary Shares”), 5¼% convertible cumulative redeemable preference shares of US\$10.00 each (“Convertible Preference Shares”) and warrants carrying rights to subscribe for new Ordinary Shares at a subscription price of HK\$0.25 per share (subject to adjustment) on or before 26th July, 2007 (Stock Code: 1011) (“2007 Warrants”) on the terms set out in the Ordinary Resolution 5(A) (the “Repurchase Proposal”) as contained in the Notice of the 2007 Annual General Meeting.

LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Re-election of Directors

In accordance with Bye-law 109(A) of the Bye-laws of the Company and for compliance with the Code on Corporate Governance Practices (the “Code”) set out in Appendix 14 of the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the “Stock Exchange”) (the “Listing Rules”), Dr. Francis CHOI Chee Ming (Vice Chairman and Non-Executive Director), Ms. Alice KAN Lai Kuen (Independent Non-Executive Director) and Miss LO Po Man (Executive Director) will retire from office by rotation at the 2007 Annual General Meeting.

Dr. Francis CHOI Chee Ming, Ms. Alice KAN Lai Kuen and Miss LO Po Man (collectively, the “Retiring Directors”), being eligible, have offered themselves for re-election at the 2007 Annual General Meeting.

The re-election of the Retiring Directors at the 2007 Annual General Meeting will not be for any specific term of office, but they will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws of the Company and the retirement requirement under the Code. The particulars of the Retiring Directors offering for re-election, which are required to be disclosed pursuant to the Listing Rules, are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

General Mandate to Repurchase Shares and Warrants

The Directors wish to seek the approval of Shareholders of the Company to the Repurchase Mandate for the Repurchase Proposal. The explanatory statement regarding the Repurchase Proposal required to be sent to Shareholders in accordance with the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Notice of Annual General Meeting

The Notice of the 2007 Annual General Meeting is contained in pages 10 to 12 of this circular and details relating to the procedures of voting by poll at general meetings of the Company are set out in Appendix III to this circular.

(I) Dr. Francis Choi Chee Ming, JP (Vice Chairman and Non-Executive Director)

Dr. Francis Choi, aged 61, was invited to the Board as a Non-Executive Director and was elected the Vice Chairman in 2004. Dr. Choi holds a master degree in business administration from the Newport University in the United States of America and a bachelor degree in business administration from the Sussex College of Technology in the United Kingdom. He also holds a Ph. D in Business Management from Harbin Institute of Technology, the People's Republic of China. Dr. Choi is the chairman of Early Light International (Holdings) Ltd. and has extensive business interests in the manufacturing industry and the property sector. He is the Honorary President of the Toys Manufacturer's Association of Hong Kong, Honorary President of the Hong Kong Young Industrialists Council and the Council Member of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He is also a Member of National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference. Dr. Choi is also the vice chairman and non-executive director of Town Health International Holdings Company Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange. Save as disclosed herein, Dr. Choi has not held any directorships in other listed public companies during the last three years.

Dr. Choi's directorship with the Company is subject to retirement by rotation pursuant to the relevant provisions under the Bye-laws of the Company. Dr. Choi does not have a service contract with the Group. Dr. Choi is entitled to normal Director's fee in the amount of HK\$100,000 per annum in acting as a Director of the Company. As Dr. Choi is a member of the Audit Committee of the Company, he is also entitled to normal fee in the amount of HK\$50,000 per annum in acting as a member of the Audit Committee.

As at 25th April, 2007 (the "Latest Practicable Date"), Dr. Choi directly holds interests in 2,400,000 issued ordinary shares and derivative interests in 400,000,000 new ordinary shares of the Company and also indirectly holds, through his controlled corporation, derivative interests in 400,000,000 new ordinary shares of the Company, in aggregate representing approximately 8.76% of the existing issued ordinary share capital of the Company, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed herein, Dr. Choi does not have any other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

There is no information that is required to be disclosed by Dr. Choi pursuant to Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders of the Company in relation to the re-election of Dr. Choi.

(II) Ms. Alice KAN Lai Kuen (Independent Non-Executive Director)

Ms. Alice Kan, aged 52, was invited to the Board as an Independent Non-Executive Director in 2004. Ms. Kan is a shareholder and the managing director of Asia Investment Management Limited providing corporate advisory and investment management services and Asia Investment Research Limited involving in research work in Hong Kong and China based companies. She is a licensed person under the SFO to carry out certain regulated activities. She has over 17 years of experience in corporate finance and is well experienced in both the equity and debt markets. She formerly held various senior positions in international and local banks and financial institutions. Ms. Kan is a fellow member of The Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, a fellow member of CPA Australia and an associate member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. She is a fellow

member of the Hong Kong Institute of Directors. Ms. Kan is an independent non-executive director of Shougang Concord International Enterprises Company Limited, Shougang Concord Technology Holdings Limited, G-Vision International (Holdings) Limited, Shimao Property Holdings Limited and Sunway International Holdings Limited, all of which are companies listed on the Stock Exchange. She was previously an independent non-executive director of SNP Leefung Holdings Limited, which was privatised and delisted in Hong Kong in September 2006. Save as disclosed herein, Ms. Kan has not held any directorships in other listed public companies during the last three years.

Ms. Kan's directorship with the Company is subject to retirement by rotation pursuant to the relevant provisions under the Bye-laws of the Company. Ms. Kan does not have a service contract with the Group. Ms. Kan is entitled to normal Director's fee in the amount of HK\$100,000 per annum in acting as a Director of the Company. As Ms. Kan is a member of the Audit Committee of the Company, she is also entitled to normal fee in the amount of HK\$50,000 per annum in acting as a member of the Audit Committee.

Ms. Kan does not hold any interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. She does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

There is no information that is required to be disclosed by Ms. Kan pursuant to Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders of the Company in relation to the re-election of Ms. Kan.

(III) Miss LO Po Man (*Executive Director*)

Miss Lo, aged 27, was appointed to the Board in 2004 and is an Executive Director of the Company. Miss Lo graduated from Duke University, North Carolina, U.S.A. with a bachelor degree in psychology. She is also an executive director of Century City International Holdings Limited ("Century"), the ultimate listed holding company of Paliburg Holdings Limited ("Paliburg"), and Paliburg. Miss Lo joined the Group in 2000 and has been involved in the marketing and sales functions of the Group. She is an executive director of the estate agency business of the Group and has undertaken an active role in directing the marketing campaign of the Regalia Bay luxury residential development in Stanley, Hong Kong. Besides, she also undertakes responsibilities in the business development function of the Group. Save as disclosed herein, Miss Lo has not held any directorships in other listed public companies during the last three years.

Miss Lo's directorship with the Company is subject to retirement by rotation pursuant to the relevant provisions under the Bye-laws of the Company. She has a service contract with the Group, which is determinable by either party on 3 months' notice. Under her service contract, she is presently entitled to receive from the Group emoluments of HK\$80,100 per month, which were determined by reference to industry norm and market conditions and allocated on the basis of the services rendered to the Group, and in addition performance based discretionary bonus and share option and other related employee benefits. Miss Lo is also entitled to normal Director's fee in the amount of HK\$100,000 per annum in acting as a Director of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Miss Lo directly or indirectly holds interests in an aggregate number of 5,503,898 issued Ordinary Shares of the Company, derivative interests in 187,792 new Ordinary Shares through interests in certain 2007 Warrants and derivative interests in 30,000,000 new Ordinary Shares through certain share options granted to her under “The Regal Hotels International Holdings Limited Share Option Scheme” of the Company, in aggregate representing approximately 0.39% of the existing issued ordinary share capital of the Company, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Miss Lo directly holds interests in 740,437 issued ordinary shares of HK\$0.01 each of Century and derivative interests in 148,087 new ordinary shares of Century, in aggregate representing approximately 0.005% of the existing issued ordinary share capital of Century, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. She also directly holds derivative interests in 10,000,000 new ordinary shares of HK\$0.01 each of Paliburg through certain share options granted to her under “The Paliburg Holdings Limited Share Option Scheme” of Paliburg, representing approximately 0.14% of the existing issued ordinary share capital of Paliburg, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Miss Lo is the daughter of Mr. LO Yuk Sui, the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Company, Century and Paliburg and the controlling shareholder of Century, and the sister of Mr. Jimmy LO Chun To, an Executive Director of the Company, Century and Paliburg. Save as disclosed herein, Miss Lo does not have any other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

There is no information that is required to be disclosed by Miss Lo pursuant to Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders of the Company in relation to the re-election of Miss Lo.

This is the explanatory statement to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Proposal, as required by the relevant rules set out in the Listing Rules to regulate the repurchase by companies with primary listings on the Stock Exchange of their own securities on the Stock Exchange or on another stock exchange recognised for this purpose by the Securities and Futures Commission and the Stock Exchange. The Ordinary Shares and the 2007 Warrants are listed on the Stock Exchange and the Convertible Preference Shares are listed on Société de la Bourse de Luxembourg (“Luxembourg Stock Exchange”).

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 9,159,929,298 Ordinary Shares and 16,748 Convertible Preference Shares in issue and outstanding 2007 Warrants carrying subscription rights in an aggregate amount of HK\$56,639,920.00 to subscribe for a total number of 226,559,680 new Ordinary Shares at the subscription price of HK\$0.25 per share (subject to adjustment).

Subject to the passing of the Ordinary Resolution 5(A) referred to in the letter from the Chairman preceding this appendix, the Company would be allowed under the buy back mandate to repurchase a maximum of 915,992,929 Ordinary Shares, 1,674 Convertible Preference Shares and 2007 Warrants carrying aggregate subscription rights of HK\$5,663,992.00, on the assumption that there will be no variation in the issued Ordinary Shares and Convertible Preference Shares and the outstanding 2007 Warrants during the period up to 12th June, 2007.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Proposal is in the interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Such purchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per share or may otherwise be in the interests of the Company, and will only be made when the Directors believe that such purchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Pursuant to the buy back mandate, repurchases would be funded entirely from the Company’s funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company’s Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws and the laws of Bermuda. Any shares repurchased under the buy back mandate must be funded out of the capital paid up on the repurchased shares or the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution, or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares. Any premium payable on the repurchase must be provided for out of the funds of the Company otherwise available for dividend or distribution or out of the Company’s share premium account.

There might be material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 31st December, 2006) in the event that the proposed repurchases were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the buy back mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

4. SHARE AND WARRANT PRICES

The highest and lowest prices at which the Ordinary Shares and the 2007 Warrants have traded on the Stock Exchange and the Convertible Preference Shares have traded on the Luxembourg Stock Exchange, respectively, in each of the previous twelve months and in April 2007 (up to the Latest Practicable Date) were as follows:

Notes: (i) No Convertible Preference Shares have traded on the Luxemburg Stock Exchange since September 2003. The highest and lowest prices of the Convertible Preference Shares last traded on the Luxemburg Stock Exchange in August 2003 were US\$325,000 and US\$215,000 respectively. The Convertible Preference Shares have a Reference Amount of US\$1,000 each for the purposes of redemption and conversion.

(ii) The 2007 Warrants are traded in board lots of 20,000 units amounting to an aggregate subscription rights of HK\$5,000.

5. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any shares or warrants to the Company under the Repurchase Proposal if such is approved by Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Ordinary Resolution 5(A) in accordance with the Listing Rules and the laws of Bermuda.

No other connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell shares or warrants to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Proposal is approved by Shareholders.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Paliburg, the listed subsidiary of Century (of which Mr. Lo Yuk Sui is the Chairman and controlling shareholder), held approximately 45.88% shareholding interests in the issued Ordinary Shares of the Company. Paliburg also held approximately 20.54% interests in the issued Convertible Preference Shares of the Company and approximately 23.92% interests in the outstanding 2007 Warrants of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

In the event that the Repurchase Mandate in respect of the Ordinary Shares granted to the Directors pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal were to be carried out in full, the shareholding interests of Paliburg in the Company would increase to approximately 50.98% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, assuming there are no other changes in the capital structure of the Company. Pursuant to Rule 32 of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers (the "Takeover Code"), such resultant increase in shareholding interests would be treated as an acquisition of the voting rights for the purpose of the Takeover Code. Accordingly, Paliburg might become obliged to make a mandatory offer as and when the 2% creeper under Rule 26 of the Takeover Code is exceeded. Save as aforesaid, based on information known to date, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeover Code even if the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full. Nevertheless, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, trigger any potential consequences under the Takeover Code.

6. SECURITIES PURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not purchased any of its Ordinary Shares, Convertible Preference Shares and 2007 Warrants (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the date of this circular.

Pursuant to the Bye-laws of the Company, the procedures of voting by poll on the resolutions to be put forth for Shareholders' approval at the 2007 Annual General Meeting of the Company are as follows:

- (1) According to Bye-law 78, at any general meeting, a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands or on the withdrawal of any other demand for a poll) demanded:
 - (a) by the Chairman of the meeting; or
 - (b) by at least three Shareholders present in person (or, in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or
 - (c) by any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person (or, in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all the Shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or
 - (d) by a Shareholder or Shareholders present in person (or, in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy and holding shares in the Company conferring a right to vote at the meeting, being shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the shares conferring that right.
- (2) According to Bye-law 79, if a poll is demanded as aforesaid under Bye-law 78, it shall be taken in such manner (including the use of ballot or voting papers or tickets) and at such time and place, not being more than thirty days from the date of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the poll was demanded, as the Chairman directs. No notice need to be given of a poll not taken immediately. The result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn, with the consent of the Chairman, at any time before the close of the meeting or the taking of the poll, whichever is the earlier.

In accordance with the requirements under Chapter 13 of the Listing Rules, the Company will publish an announcement in newspapers the results of any voting by poll at the 2007 Annual General Meeting on the business day following the Meeting.

- (d) the aggregate amount of subscription rights attached to the 2007 Warrants which may be purchased by the Company pursuant to paragraph (a) above shall not exceed 10% of the total amount of subscription rights attached to the 2007 Warrants outstanding at the date of this Resolution, and the said approval shall be limited accordingly; and
- (e) for the purpose of this Resolution, “Relevant Period” means the period from the passing of this Resolution until whichever is the earlier of:
- (i) the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company;

- (B) “**THAT** the exercise by the Directors during the Relevant Period (as defined in Resolution 5(A) set out in the Notice of this Meeting) of all the powers of the Company to issue, allot and dispose of additional Ordinary Shares of the Company (including making and granting offers, agreements and options which would or might require Ordinary Shares to be issued, allotted or disposed of, whether during or after the end of the Relevant Period) be and is hereby generally and unconditionally approved, provided that, otherwise than pursuant to a rights issue where Ordinary Shares are offered to shareholders on a fixed record date in proportion to their then holdings of Ordinary Shares (subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient in relation to fractional entitlements or having regard to any restrictions or obligations under the laws of, or the requirements of any recognised regulatory body or any stock exchange in, any territory outside Hong Kong), the additional Ordinary Shares issued, allotted or disposed of (including Ordinary Shares agreed conditionally or unconditionally to be issued, allotted or disposed of, whether pursuant to an option or otherwise) shall not in aggregate exceed 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the Ordinary Shares in issue at the date of this Resolution, and the said approval shall be limited accordingly.”
- (C) “**THAT** the general mandate granted to the Directors under Resolution 5(B) above be and is hereby extended by the addition of an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of Ordinary Shares purchased by the Company pursuant to the general mandate approved in Resolution 5(A) above.”
